ZUBIN MEHTA AND VIENNA PHILHARMONIC ENTHRAL SELL-OUT ABU DHABI CLASSICS AUDIENCE AT AL JAHILI FORT

Under the patronage of His Excellency Sheikh Sultan bin Tahnoon Al Nahyan, Chairman of Abu Dhabi Authority for Culture and Heritage, Abu Dhabi Classics presented an exquisite musical event at Al Jahili Fort on Friday, 13 March 2009. The evening marked the UAE debut of world-renowned conductor Zubin Mehta and arguably one of the best musical ensembles in the world, the Vienna Philharmonic. Mehta conducted the orchestra, performing masterpieces by Schubert and Strauss, leaving

members of the sold-out audience mesmerized.

Mehta is a highly accomplished conductor, born in Bombay in 1936. By 1961, Mehta had already conducted the Vienna and the Berlin Philharmonic Orchestras, and still retains close ties with these ensembles. His list of awards and honors is extensive and includes the "Nikisch-Ring", bequeathed to him by Karl Böhm. He is an honorary citizen of Florence and was made an honorary member of the Vienna State Opera

in 1997. In 1999, he was presented the Lifetime Achievement Peace and Tolerance Award of the United Nations. In addition, Mehta is an honorary conductor of the Vienna Philharmonic, the Munich Philharmonic and the Los Angeles Philharmonic.

Since its inception in 1842, the Vienna Philharmonic has enthralled prominent composers and conductors, as well as audiences all over the world through its homogenous musical style, carefully bequeathed from one generation of musicians

to the next. The orchestra has made its mission that of communicating music's humanitarian message in the daily lives of its listeners, according to Ludwig Van Beethoven's motto: "From the heart, to the heart".

Abu Dhabi Classics is offering further highlights including a UAE solo debut by Lang Lang on Wednesday, 17 March, and Symphonic Masterworks, celebrating Spanish and Russian masterpieces, also at the Emirates Palace Auditorium.

THE TENNIS MATCH THAT CHANGED THE WORLD OF WOMEN

Billie Jean King was on television earlier this week on Emirates MBC Channel 48, in a replay of an October 12 broadcast of Oprah.

I, like so many others, watched Bille Jean's tennis match with Bobbie Riggs years ago. More than 50 million viewers, a record number, watched that television broadcast.

When Billy Jean won that tennis match of critical acclaim, women in sports only made 37 percent of what the male players made. Today, Serena and Venus Williams make the same money as their male counterparts on the tennis court. I trust a good number of you were able to catch the competitive play of the sisters in the Dubai Tennis Championship.

More importantly, beyond money, is respectability. The sisters and Billie Jean join Bobbie Riggs on Wikipedia -- their lives documented as something of worth.

Also, Title IX of the Civil

Rights Act, one of the key clauses of that U.S. legislation, was formulated because of young women of Billy Jean's time wanting to be full participants in sports.

This brought greater educational opportunities through sports scholarships for women to colleges and universities. Fifty-five percent of college graduates now are women. And, today, young women around the world get to fully participate in sports in most countries.

I recall from that time how I cheered for Billie Jean because I was not allowed to participate in sports in elementary and high school -- only the polka, the waltz and the two-step in eighth grade physical education. I longed and longed to play sports.

As a youth, I was such a pitcher of baseball. I became that way because my brothers would not allow me to bat the ball. They wanted to bat the ball.

They needed someone to pitch it to them.

Likewise, at our elementary school, a two-room, rural prairie school in Valley, Nebraska, all the students wanted to bat, but only the boys got to do so. If a girl wandered up to the plate to try a few swings, she was laughed off the field.

Later, as a young married woman, again it was the same. Wives, sisters and mothers went to all the games to watch husbands, brothers and fathers play softball in their intramural and community sports leagues. We women watched the children in the stands while the guys had the fun on the field.

Also, the children and I watched the stock cars while the boys raced. My former spouse drove The X-15, named by me after the rocket-powered aircraft I so admired. I did get to have my picture taken with The X-15. But, I never got to drive the stock car.

Yet, I was the one who

painted the letters X-15 on the stock car. And I was the one who went to work sewing at a clothing store to pay for the \$80 tire when it was blown so we could keep the stock car on the track.

And, I was the one who was "the bad guy" when I said, as a mother, "No more stockcar racing unless the children get milk first."

Of course, the racing had to go, and it broke my first-born's heart.

Little JK, my first-born, had draw hundreds of stock cars on every piece of paper he could find. He had added everything on the pictures that you can imagine in a supercar -- superpipes, suped-up engines, gigantic mudslicks. Who can say how much a lasting impression a father racing in a stock car has on a pre-schooler son?

I still have some of those hand-drawn, penciled treasures today.

It broke my heart at the

time that JK never drew those stock cars after I had to say that milk mattered more than tires.

Oh, it felt so good when my second-born, PC, got to play in a girl's elementary baseball league. Talking about super -- it was Pamela out there on the field. She has always had such good coordination, and I know it is because of athletic opportunities like that.

Then JF, my third-born, got to go to a college daycamp for little girls playing basketball. And, she and friend Molly and their girl's basketball team beat the sixth-grade boys on the basketball court. Meanwhile, all during the game, the coach on the sideline kept hollaring out to the boys, but in the hearing of everyone, "You aren't going to let those girls beat you?"

Such comments, unfortunately, lay the foundation of competition and even discriminatory actions between genders,

in a world in which we all need to work together, no matter what our talents might be.

The guys did not have a chance in that one. Little girls mature faster than little boys, and they stood head and shoulders above the other team on the court. Tall like her father, all Jessica had to say as she bounced the ball around the court to the other tall player, was, "Molly, Molly, Molly!" And, her friend caught the ball and sunk it in the basket.

One thing my mother said when I was growing up has proved to be quite wise: Never "play" in anything where you are only a spectator. Be a full participant, or pass it by.

I trust all of you are raising your children, whether boy or girl, or girl or boy, to be full participants in life.

The way children feel about themselves, their self-esteem, is at stake.

Brownies Cheesecake



Ingredients:

- 1 1/3 cup of Hershey's chocolate kisses
- 6 large tablespoons butter
- 1 1/4 cup sugar
- 2 eggs
- 1 1/4 cup flour
- 1/3 cup cocoa
- 1/2 tsp baking powder
- 1 tsp vanilla
- Pinch of salt
- For the cheese:
- 3 packets Philadelphia cheese
- 3 eggs
- 3/4 cup sugar
- 1 tsp vanilla

Method:

Mix butter and sugar. Add the eggs and mix. Add flour, cocoa and baking powder and 1 tsp vanilla.

Place mixed ingredients into a baking tray (one that can be opened from the side and bake in the oven at medium heat for 25 minutes.

Mix all ingredients for the cheese together. Remove the baked cake from the oven and place the Hershey's kisses on top. Pour cheese mixture on top. Return to oven at medium heat for 35-40 minutes. Garnish with cocoa (you can dissolve 2Tb cocoa in 1 Tb butter for the garnish).

Note: You can use low fat cream cheese or full fat. You can also use flavoured Hershey Kisses instead of plain.

What a special position a mother has in this world! And honestly, she deserves it. It is my honest opinion that it is also one of the hardest positions for a person in this world.



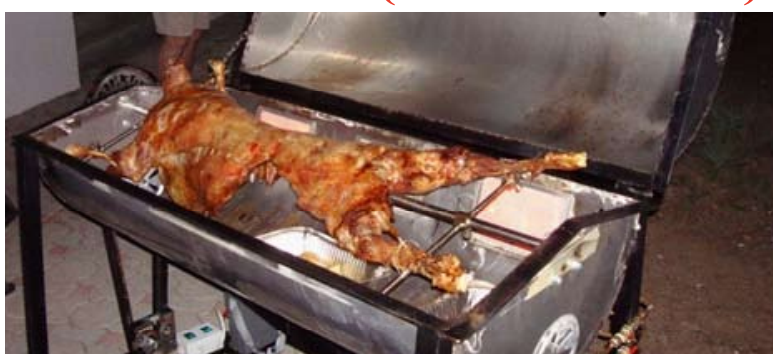
